# Scope of Work Requirements – Educational Agencies

Roles and responsibilities of the Educational Agency receiving a Parent Mentor grant must include:

- Ensure that the Parent Mentor is involved in educational agency activities (e.g., attend staff meetings, participate in training, serve on committees)
- Work with the Parent Mentor through regular and ongoing communication to implement services



# Scope of Work Requirements – Educational Agencies

Roles and responsibilities of the Educational Agency receiving a Parent Mentor grant must include:

- Attend the following (or ensure that an alternate designee attend): OCALICON Parent Mentor session; Parent Mentor Spring Conference – fully day; New Parent Mentor Orientation session (only if you have a new Parent Mentor)
- Submit project evaluation data to the Office for Exceptional Children and/or the OSU team at CETE upon request.

# Scope of Work Requirements – Parent Mentors

## Expected duties of the Parent Mentor:

- Attend required events
- Submit project evaluation data by the provided deadlines to the OSU team at CETE for reporting to the Office for Exceptional Children
- Attend evaluation team report (ETR) /Individualized Education Program (IEP)- related meetings at family or district request (may be face-to-face, virtual, by phone, etc.)

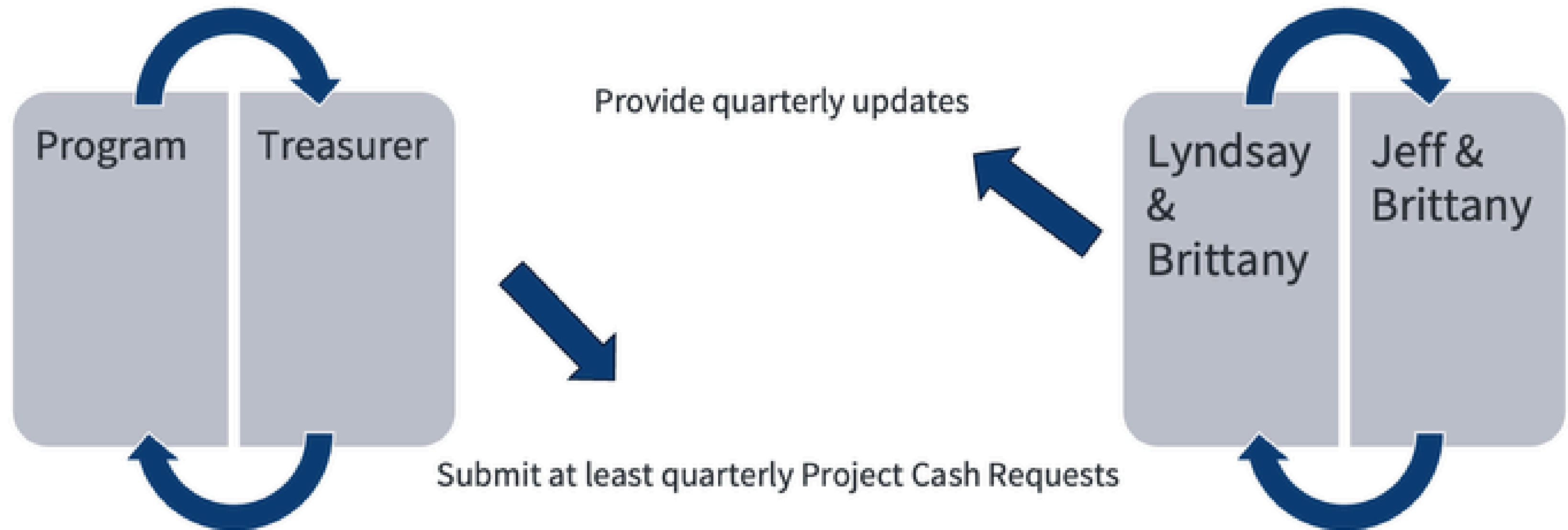
# Monitoring Compliance with Grant Expectations

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- Monthly data review by OEC team of data provided by OSU as submitted by Parent Mentors
  - Intervention
- Site Visits
- Your role in compliance with grant expectations:
  - Alignment of this work with DEW priorities and detailed in Scope of Work responses
  - Attending required events (Parent Mentor and Educational Agency representative)
  - Regular meetings between the Parent Mentor and Educational Agency representative
  - Accurate and timely Parent Mentor data collection

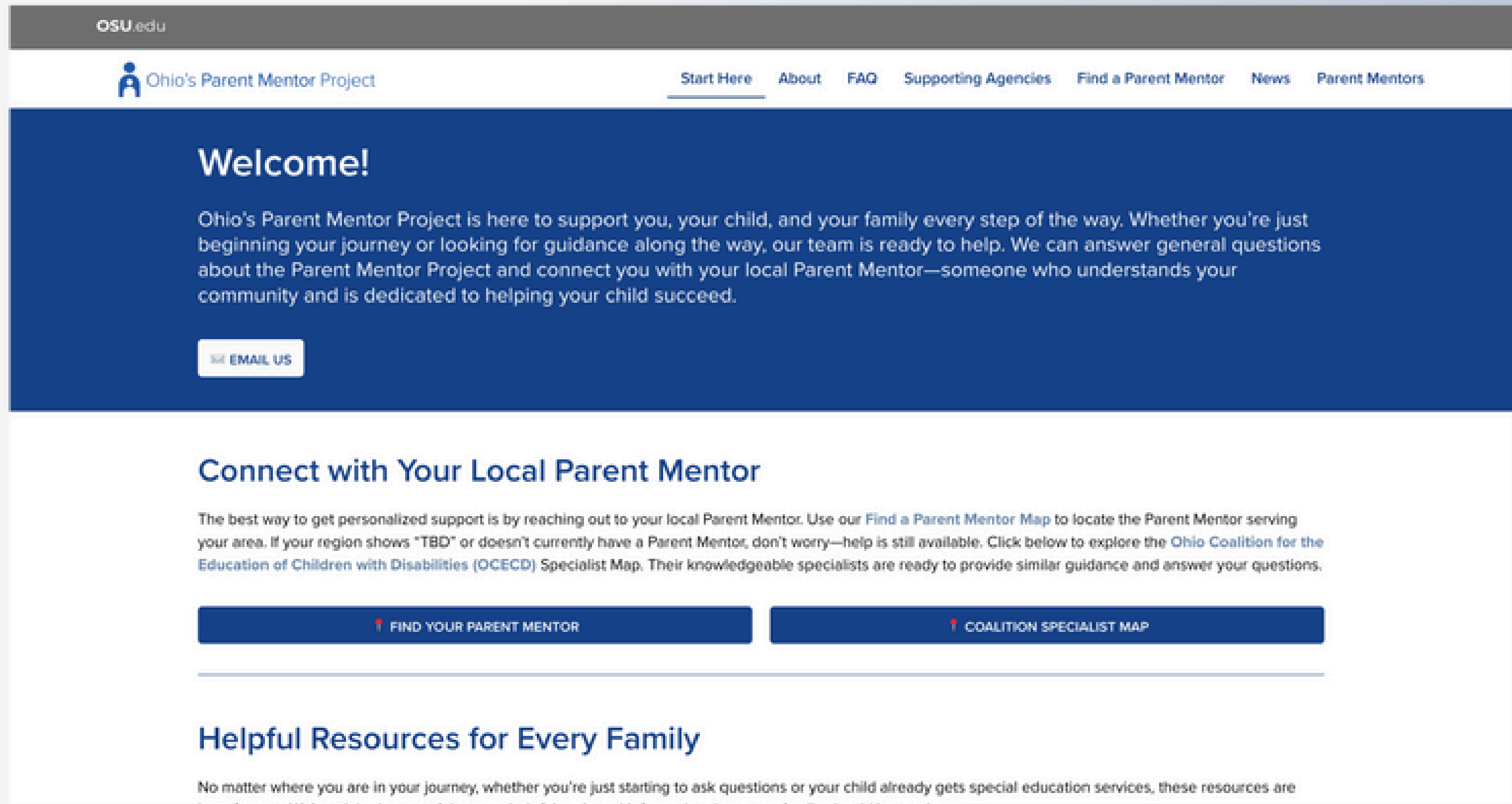



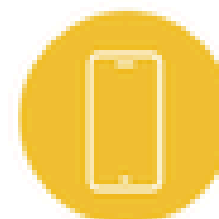

# About Language

Before moving forward, it is worth mentioning that there is a language consideration you may notice. **Person-first language** emphasizes the person before the identity or disability, such as person who is deaf or a child with autism.

**Identity-first language** puts the identity or disability first in the description, as in deaf person or autistic person, recognizing the culture or community.

When referring to learners in this presentation you may notice the use of **both** person-first and identity-first language to ensure that all people have their preferences respected and represented.

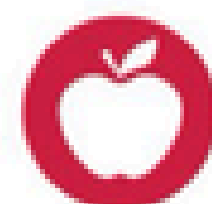

# TRANSITION-WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

## Student with a Disability (SWD) =

- Age 14 through not yet 22
- Has a disability (e.g., learning, behavior, mental health, mobility, hearing, vision, etc.)
- Is in a recognized education program (enrolled in high school counts)

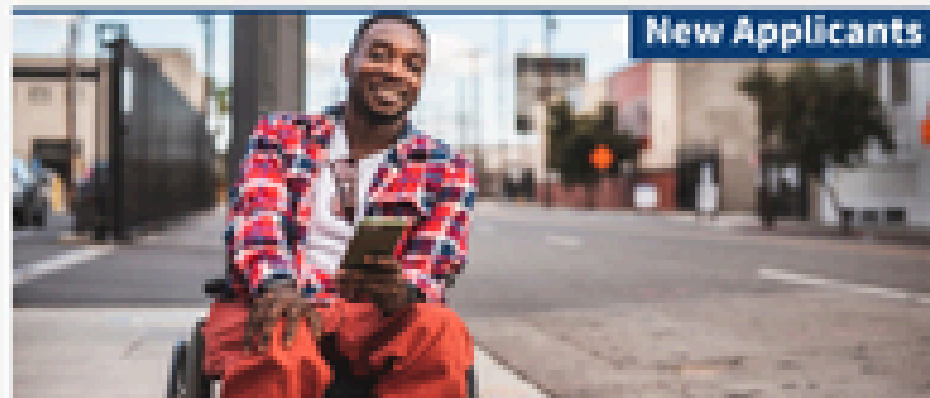

# OVERVIEW

- Ohio Family and Children First (OFCF) is a partnership of government agencies and community organizations committed to improving the well-being of children and their families.
- OFCF started as an initiative of the Office of the Governor in 1991, building upon previous legislation.
- The Ohio General Assembly codified OFCF in 1993.

# OUR PURPOSE

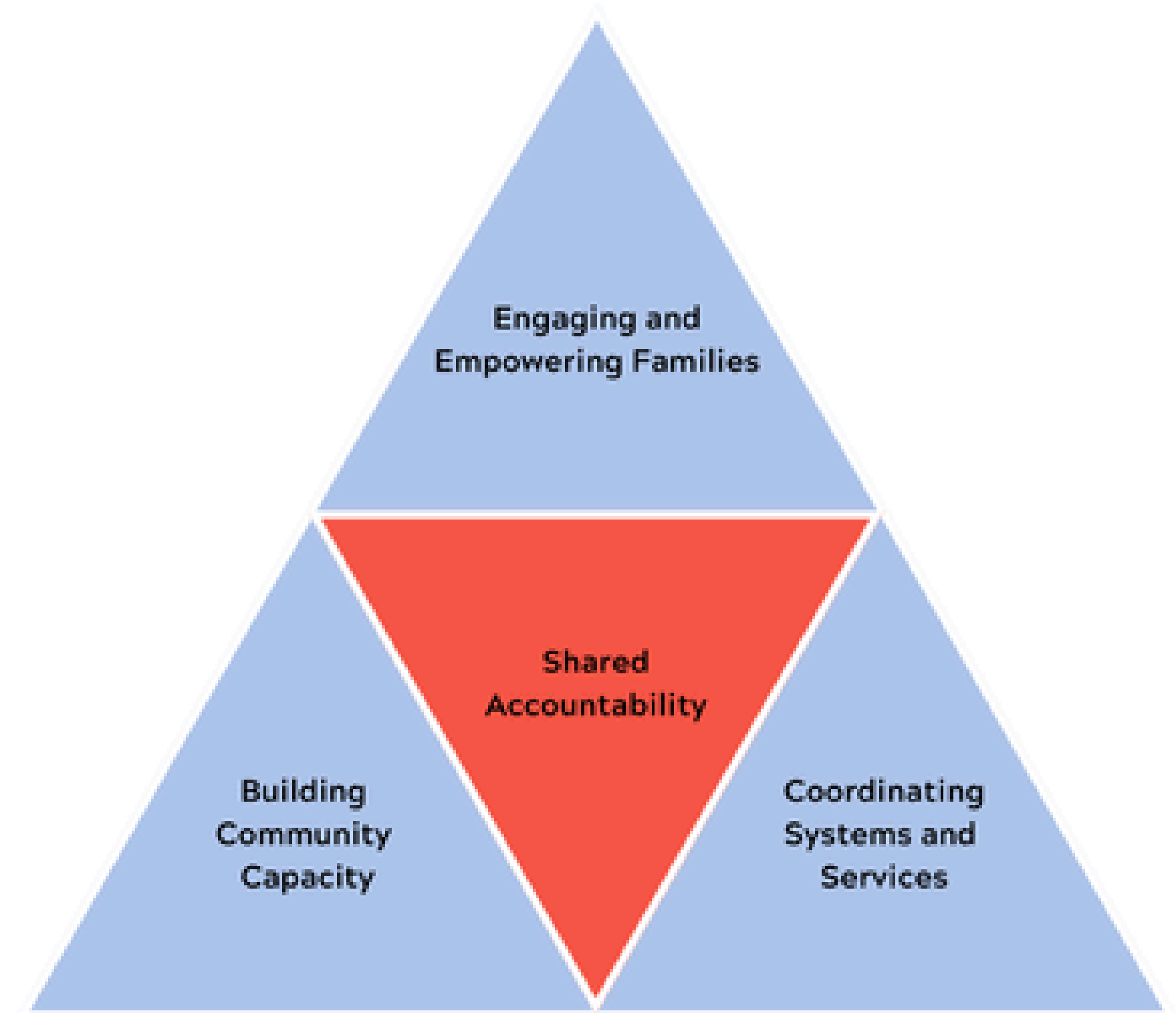
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Ohio Family and Children First Cabinet Council was created in statute (ORC 121.37) in 1993 with the specific purpose:

***“...to help families seeking government services...by streamlining and coordinating existing services for families seeking assistance for their children.”***

# FCFC CORE FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Engaging and Empowering Families
- Building Community Capacity
- Coordinating Systems and Services
- Shared Accountability



# MACRO VS. MICRO RESPONSIBILITIES

CORE FUNCTION	MACRO	MICRO
Engaging and Empowering Families	Involve families in program and policy development; Family Representatives on Council	Engaging families, Listening, Building Rapport to meet the needs of the youth and family
Building Community Capacity	Identify Gaps to Services, Supports, Funding, etc. Council is mandated to develop a 3-year shared plan to address gaps/needs within the community	Working with youth, families and teams; identify services and supports that were not previously available
Coordinating Systems and Services	Eliminate duplication of services across the county. Streamline eligibility. Pooled funding to support systems and services	Service Coordination/Wraparound (e.g. traffic controller) – connect families to needed services and supports
Shared Accountability	Council members have shared responsibility to meet the needs of youth and families in the county and improve/address community needs; not only the Council Administrator's responsibility	Everyone involved with a youth has a role and is accountable to moving activities forward

- ☐ Direct response to what families said in Listening Sessions
- ☐ PYAs provide a resource that will allow families to have their questions answered and access the support needed at a local level.
- ☐ PYAs have lived experience in social systems and will respond to inquiries by assisting with concrete support, service referrals, and benefit navigation.
- ☐ PYAs offer localized support and connection in 12 Service Delivery Areas (SDA) statewide.

# PYA'S SUPPORTING CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

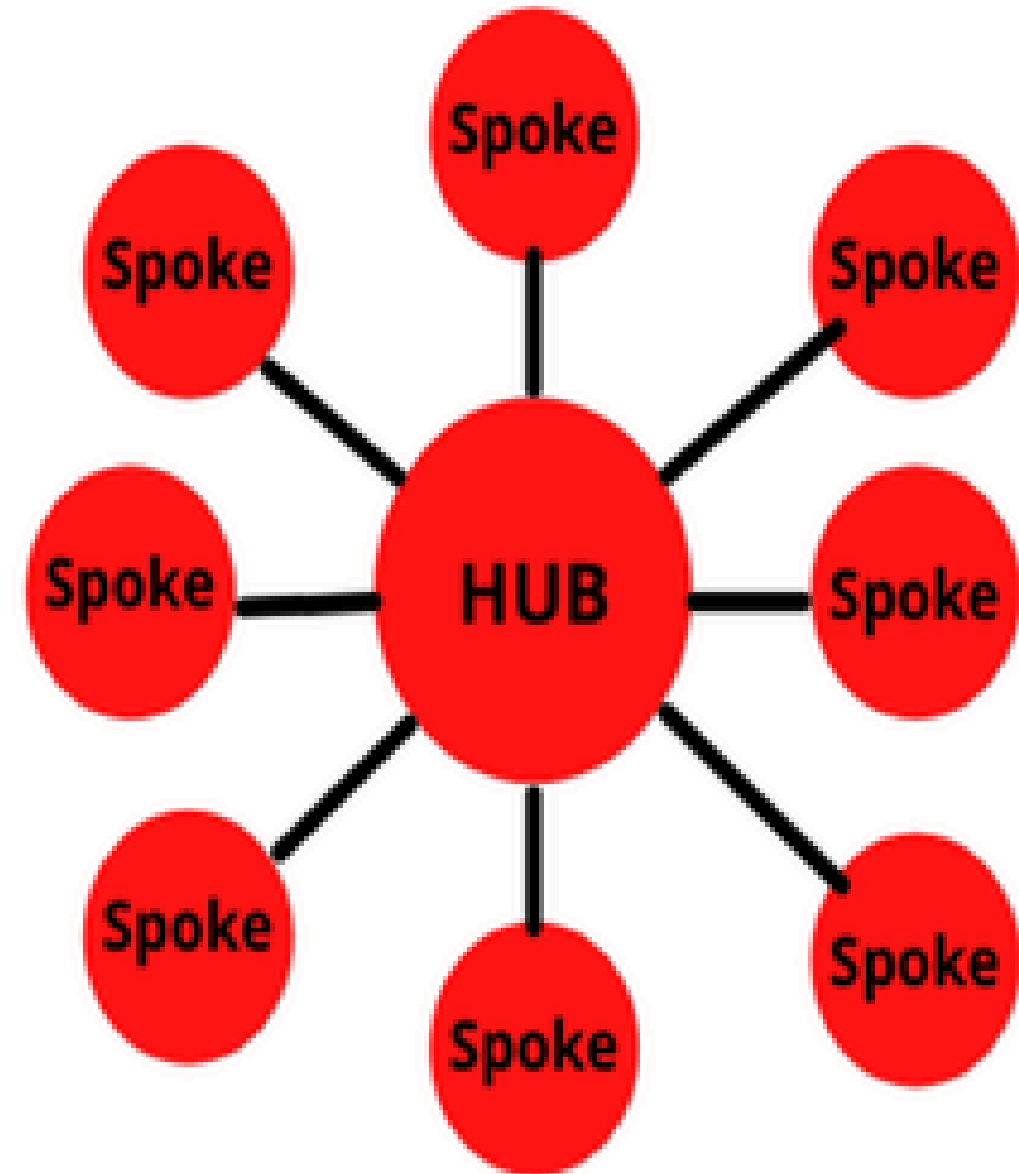
- ❑ Responding to questions and needs from individuals and families

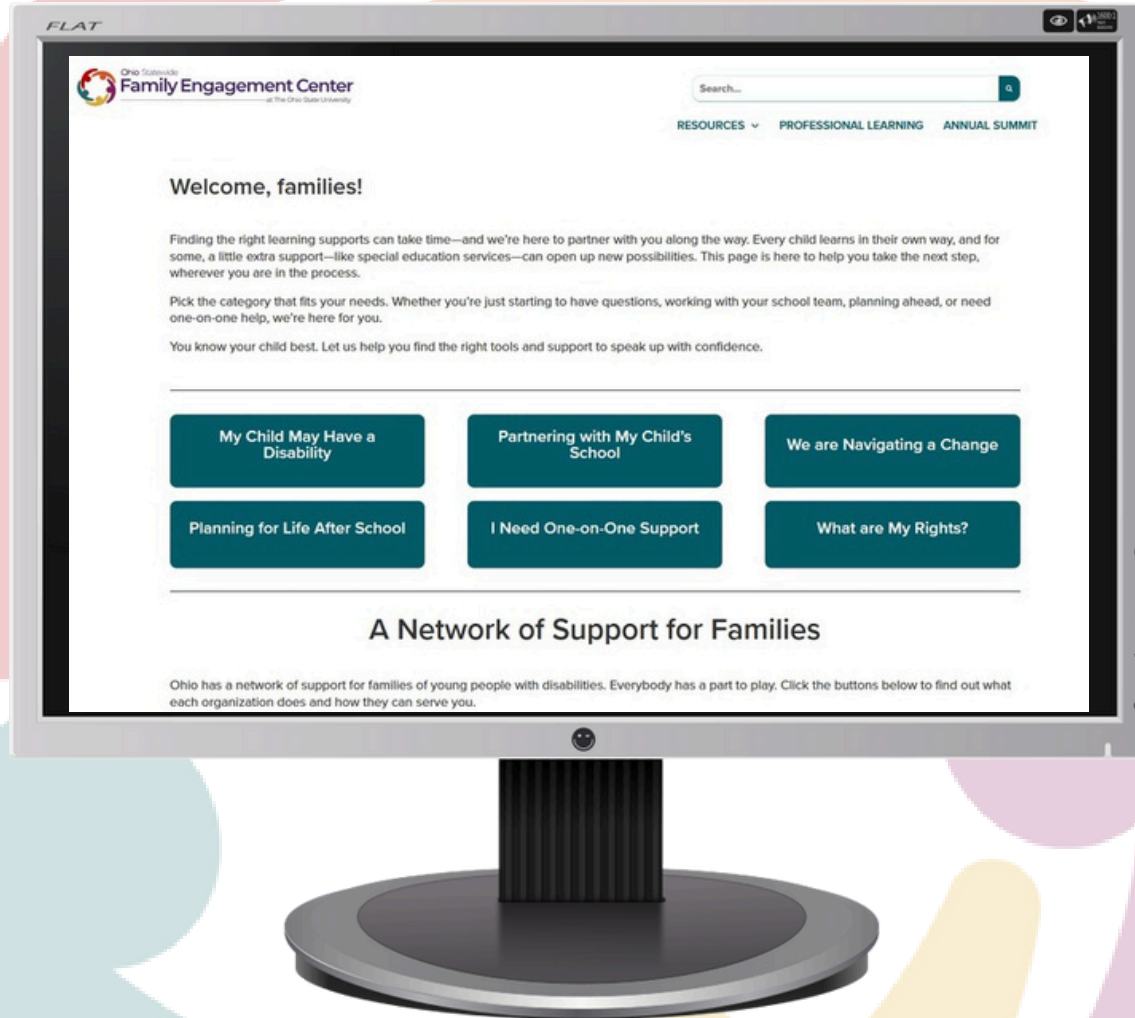

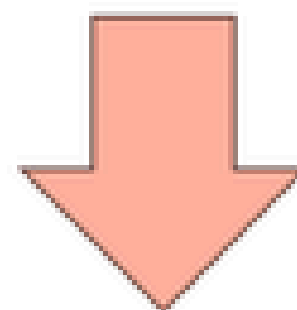

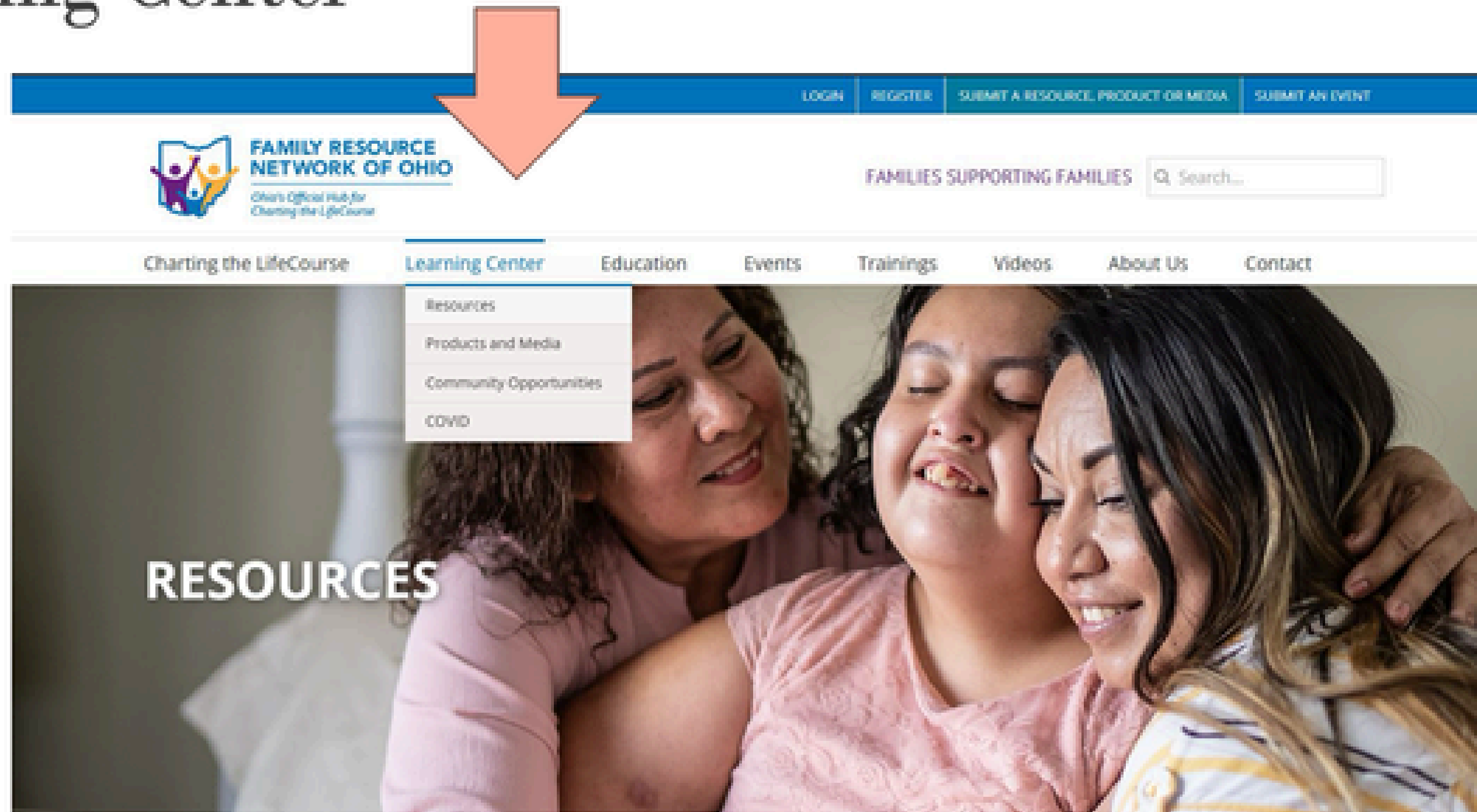
