- Support transition planning for post-secondary goals
- Provide resources for resume writing and interview prep
- Connect families with community workforce programs

### Workforce Readiness - Key Activities for a Parent Mentor

#### **Oak Hills Local School District**

- Actively participating in IEP meetings to bridge communication between families, and educators, while providing clear
  explanations and examples of age-appropriate transition assessments to support transition planning.
- Sharing information about local and state agencies that assist with postsecondary employment, vocational training, and
  independent living, while remaining accessible to answer questions and clarify complex information.
- Encouraging and supporting students to take an active role in IEP meetings and transition planning, empowering them to
  voice their preferences, interests, needs, and strengths, and preparing them to become strong self-advocates.
- Cultivating partnerships with local organizations, employers, and service providers to broaden opportunities for students
  with disabilities and strengthen the continuum of supports available to families beyond high school.

These efforts will ensure that students with disabilities are **well-prepared** for postsecondary education, training, employment, and independent living, while fostering strong school-family-community partnerships.
